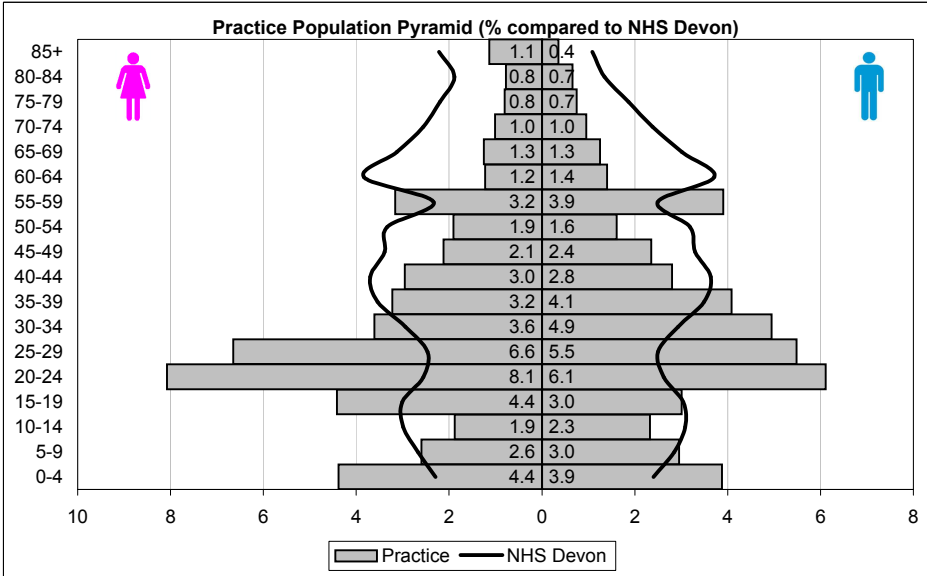

Population

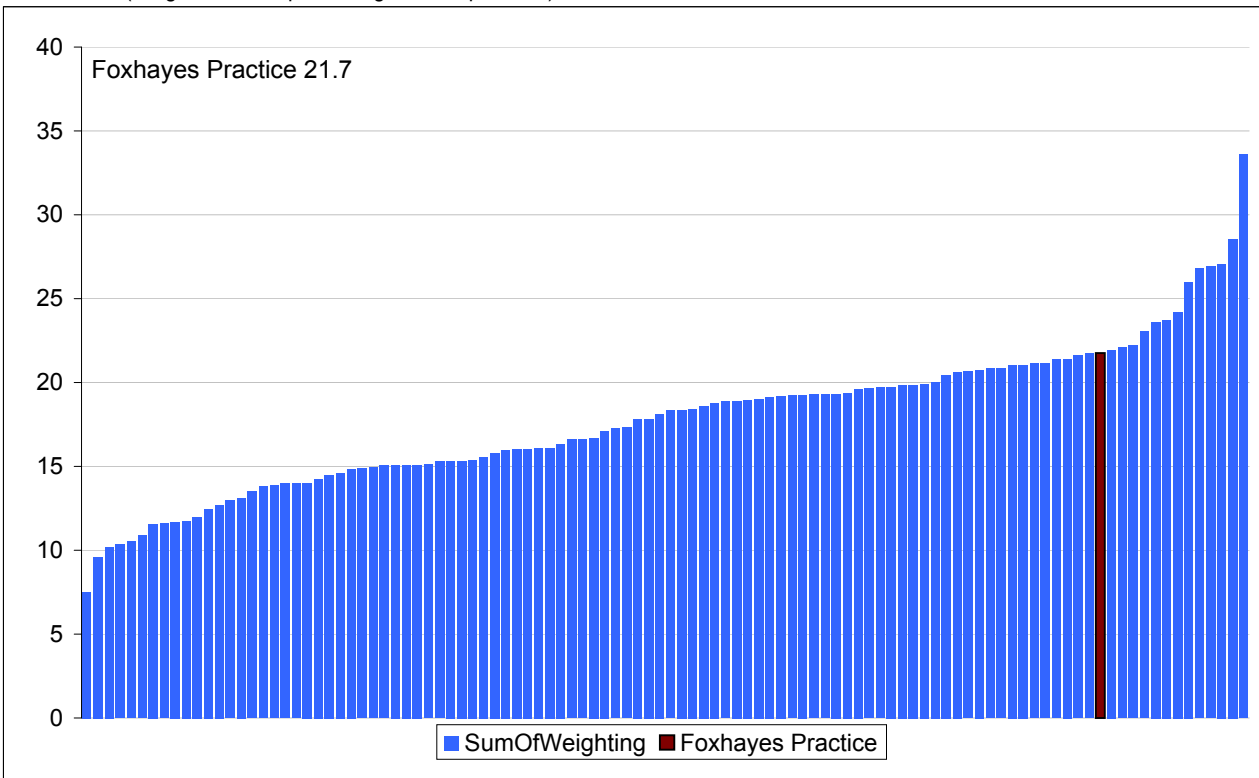

Deprivation

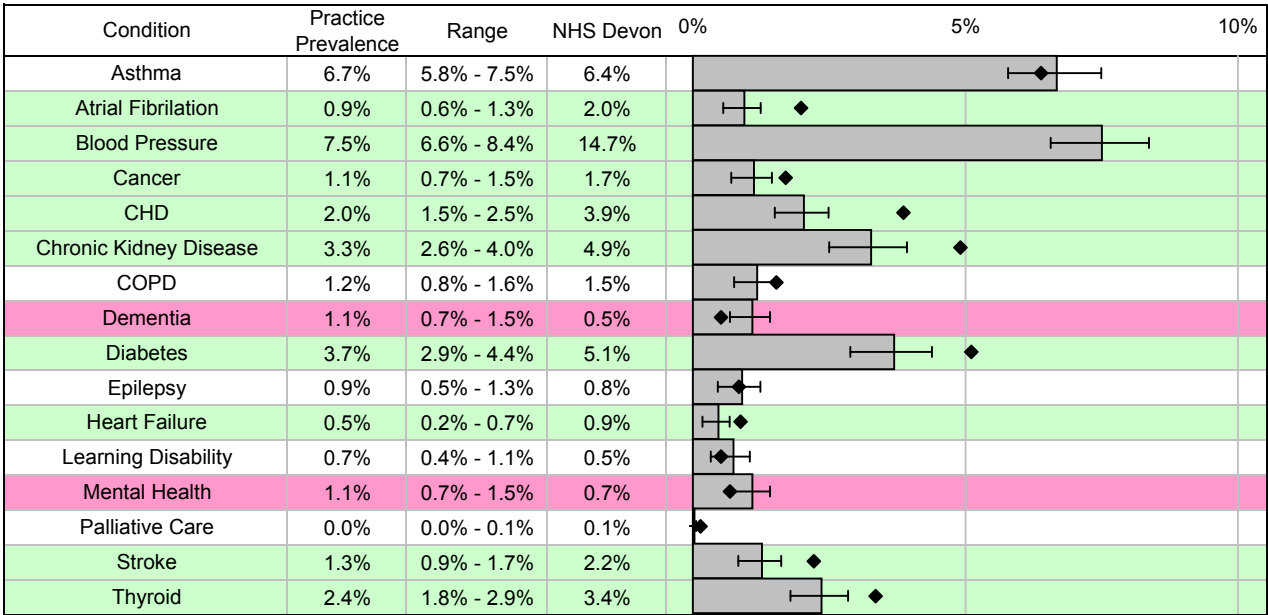
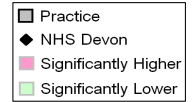
The Indices of Deprivation 2007 provide a relative ranking of areas of deprivation across England taking into consideration factors such as Income, Employment, Health and Disability, Education, Skills and Training, Barriers to Housing and Services, Living Environment and Crime. By taking this indicator and combining it with local population figures we can calculate estimates of Multiple Deprivation for each GP Practice (a higher score represents greater deprivation).

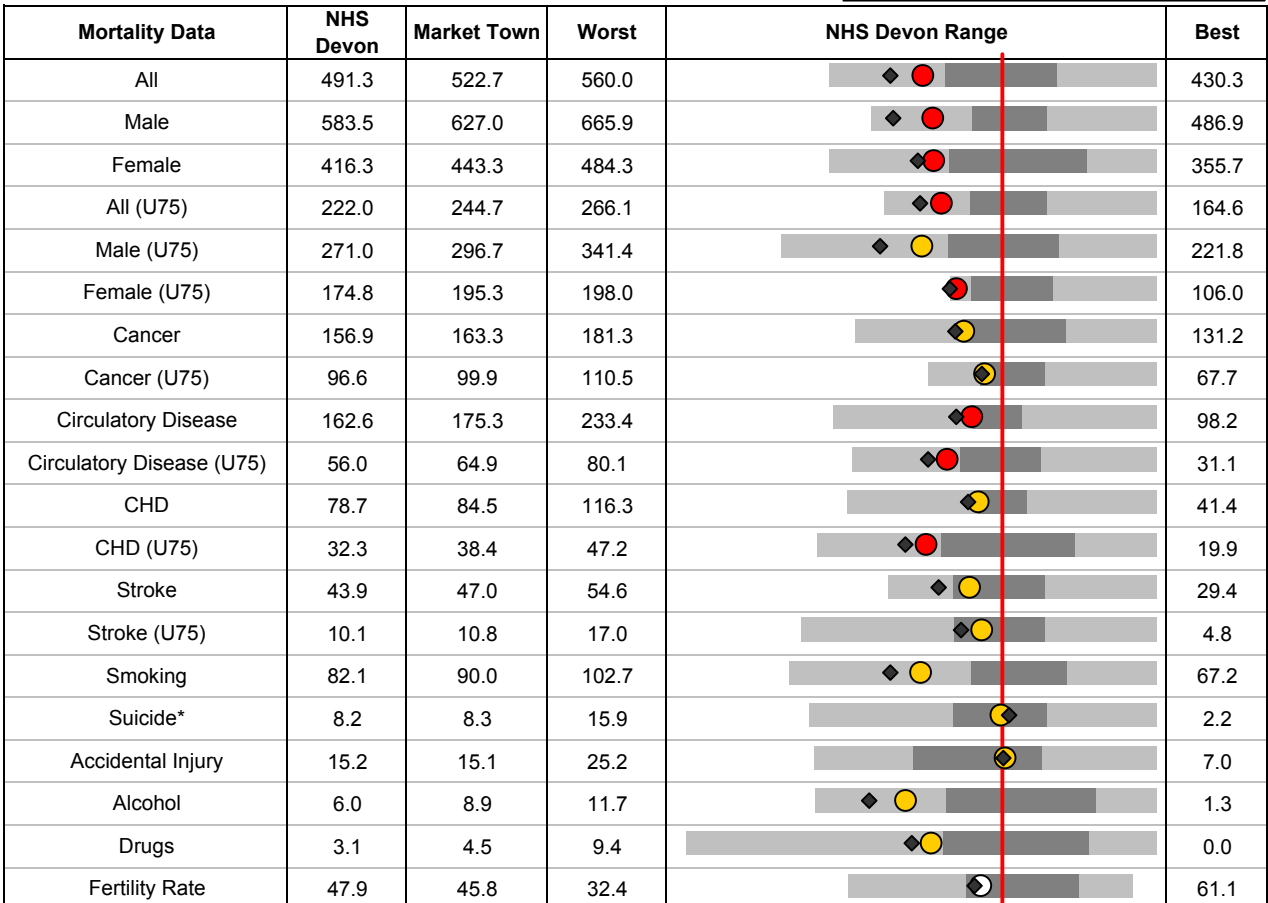
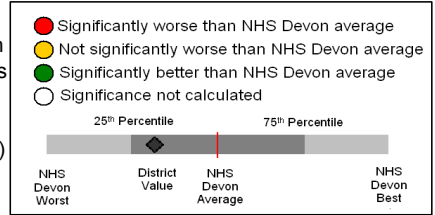
Disease Prevalence

The graph below shows the prevalence of 16 disease areas for both your practice and for NHS Devon as a whole (based on April 2010 QOF data). The shading for each condition shows whether your practice has a statistically higher (coloured red) or lower (coloured green) prevalence compared to NHS Devon as a whole.



Standardised Death Rates (by Market Town and District)

A further indicator of the health of an area is the death rate. As practice mortality data is not always available, mortality rates (standardised for age and sex) for 19 causes of death have been calculated at a market town, local authority and NHS Devon level (using deaths registered between 2005 and 2009). The spine chart below compares these three rates, and shows whether there is a statistically significant difference between the market town and NHS Devon rate. Also shown are the fertility rates (per 1,000 15-44 year old females) over the same period (NB. these rates have been standardised and so performance will not be affected by the age and gender of your population).
